Dear Friends,

It's an exciting time for Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona! We are growing our reach and impact and finding new friends all across the valley. Our volunteer board of directors is helping us make connections and build partnerships we never thought possible. As our search for land to build affordable homes intensifies, God is providing us with an increasing number of donations from families, cities and like-minded organizations.

"We bring God's people together to build homes, communities and hope." Nowhere is this more evident than in our neighborhood revitalization (NR) programs. Our multi-level partnerships in the Grand Canyon Corridor, Tempe, Chandler and growing elsewhere, are changing the face of these communities, building pride and a real sense of community. Our recent Serve the City project in cooperation with Grand Canyon University saw 222 students and faculty working together to help 11 Phoenix families improve their homes. Our NR programs require a modest payment from the homeowner and 8 hours of sweat equity on the project. Our Emergency Home Repair operation continues to serve the most needy families in Chandler and Glendale and we recently added a contract to work in the City of Tolleson.

We have also started work on our first six of 18, three-story townhomes in Tempe. As is our custom, six wall signing ceremonies were held the morning of January 28th. With over two hundred participants (families, sponsors, volunteers and staff) adding their personalized blessings and well wishes for the six families that will eventually occupy these homes. It was a magical day and we couldn't do what we do without the service of our many thousands of volunteers, who work on build sites, in our ReStores and offices. Yet, you don't need a hammer to help. We can always use your contributions in whatever form they may take: your time, used goods for our stores, property, automobiles, or a cash donation. And if you are so inclined, please consider us in your estate planning.

Indeed, it is an exciting time to be associated with Habitat. Thanks be to God for His blessings.

there's still time to save on your state taxes!

By now you've heard that Arizona made some changes to the state tax code regarding charitable tax credits. Tax credits are dollar-for-dollar reductions in a person's tax liability and thus even more valuable than deductions, which reduce the income on which taxes apply. The deadline has also been extended to April 15th.

So, what does that mean for you?

Because Habitat qualifies as an eligible charity, you can make a gift (up to \$400 as an individual or \$800 as a couple) and receive a direct credit (not a deduction) to your Arizona State Income tax at the time taxes are filed.

Do I have to itemize to claim Charitable Tax Credits?

No, You do not have to itemize deductions to claim a credit for contributions.

Can I claim this Tax Credit if I take the School Tax Credit?

Yes, they are separate credits and you are allowed to take advantage of both.

How do I know Habitat qualifies for the credit under this program?

Qualifying organizations are required to send the Department of Revenue a self-certification letter stating that they meet all qualifying criteria. The Department in turn publishes a list of self-certified organizations. You can request a list from Department of Revenue in Phoenix at 602.255.3381 or you can go to the Arizona Department of Revenue website at www.azdor.gov.

Still have questions? Call us at 602-232-1072 and redirect your tax dollars to support affordable housing today.

If 120 families directed \$800 of their Arizona tax liability to Habitat, it would cover the cost of one new Habitat home.

going vertical in tempe



Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona (Habitat) helps make home ownership a reality for those who might not qualify for a traditional home loan. The research from the Arizona Housing Alliance and Washington D.C.-based National Low Income Housing Coalition found that another 142,000 affordable rental homes are needed for the state's low-income population. That's more houses and apartments than there are in all of Scottsdale. This challenge of providing affordable housing options is additionally challenged by rapidly rising land prices. To address these challenges, Habitat has had to think outside of the box and its traditional Habitat model. At the same time, in Tempe, Arizona, a dirt lot, roughly the size of an acre, sat vacant over-looking Alegre Park. A small, grassy area where neighbors play fetch with their pets, organize soccer games and enjoy picnics under its shady trees. This beautiful property had remained dormant until the City of Tempe put out an RFP for the land.

Originally slated to hold twenty-one two bedroom townhouses, Habitat saw the opportunity to offer something more... Larger models that would accommodate families; families who work in the area but can't afford to live there as land prices continue to increase. This neighborhood with abundant public transportation, excellent school choice and its close vicinity to a beautiful green space made it an ideal location to build for Habitat families. Families, whose presence will benefit the entire neighborhood and community. So, together the Construction and Land Development departments of Habitat did some brainstorming.

Together along with architect Muffet Maerk, Habitat proposed and made plans for its first ever, three story units. Together the team submitted a proposal to the city of Tempe detailing plans for a family residential development that will include 18 total homes which equates to a density of 16.13 units per acre. The project will include 18 single-family residential homes that will be the Habitat Gemini model with two units sharing a common wall. The homes will be three (3) stories in height or 29 feet; and will include exterior patios and canopies and a two (2) car garage.

"We're excited to go vertical on this project." says Habitat President and CEO, Jason Barlow. "Working with local families and wonderful partners in this Tempe neighborhood has helped us think creatively about what affordable housing can look like. We're grateful to have this project underway."

These three story units represent new challenges for Habitat. The not-for-profit builder utilizes volunteer labor to complete unskilled tasks. Typically, on any given weekend, each Habitat home under construction is assisted by a team of 5-10 volunteer leaders, dedicated individuals who commit to managing a build from beginning to end. They manage a group of 15-25 general volunteers, often provided by the home sponsor, most of whom have little to no experience in construction or building.

The first wall signing ceremonies were held Saturday, January 28th, 2017 and the first six units are estimated for completion by June 30th, 2017. The remaining homes will be completed in stages as funding becomes available. By June 2019, **Habitat hopes to have 18 new families living, working and thriving in Tempe**.











meet the decon team



Although Habitat is widely known for building, deconstruction is also an essential part of our mission.

Habitat's FREE Deconstruction Service enables homeowners and businesses to significantly offset their remodeling costs. Deconstruction services are a no-cost solution to skillfully and carefully remove kitchen cabinets, appliances, bathroom fixtures and doors from a space before a remodel or renovation.

First, we help identify materials and items suitable for reuse. Next, all work is handled by our skilled Deconstruction Team. Finally, upon removal, salvaged items are donated to local Habitat ReStores and sold to support the mission of Habitat. (Donors receive a tax receipt for the donation.)

Since July our Decon Team has tackled 97 jobs with an estimated donation value of \$100,000. All donated items go to straight to our ReStores to support local families in need of affordable housing.
